

details can be found under the "Inspection Notice" on page one of the approved plans. The architect shall certify and report his findings in writing to this office within 30 days of project completion.

4. That Jeff Wingstrom, 317/412-2134, Environmental Public Health Division, State Department of Health, 2 North Meridian Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204, be notified at the time construction is undertaken so that all necessary inspections may be made.
5. That the pump controller be fitted with elapsed time meters and cycle counters for each of the three pumps. These will serve as diagnostic tools for pump problems, and can be used to determine average daily flow quantities pumped into the absorption fields.
6. That the owner institute a program of toilet tank flapper valve maintenance to help insure that tank leakage is minimized. This can be a huge factor that can contribute to system overloading and possible failure. It is suggested this occur on an annual basis.
7. That the permittee notify the local health department at least 7 days before construction of the approved commercial on-site wastewater disposal facilities is to begin.
8. That if pollution, health hazards, or nuisance conditions develop or are created, immediate corrective action shall be taken by the owner.
9. That no change in occupancy or use of the facility served be effected if it would result in wastewater flow on the peak day in excess of 9,000 GPD. Any such change in occupancy or use may be made only after this department has issued a construction permit for modifications to the subject wastewater disposal facility.
10. That plans and specifications for any changes or additions to this project as herewith approved be submitted and approved prior to such construction.

These plans and specifications were prepared and certified by Randall Dean Myers, Architect, Goshen, Indiana, and submitted most recently on June 22, 2010.
